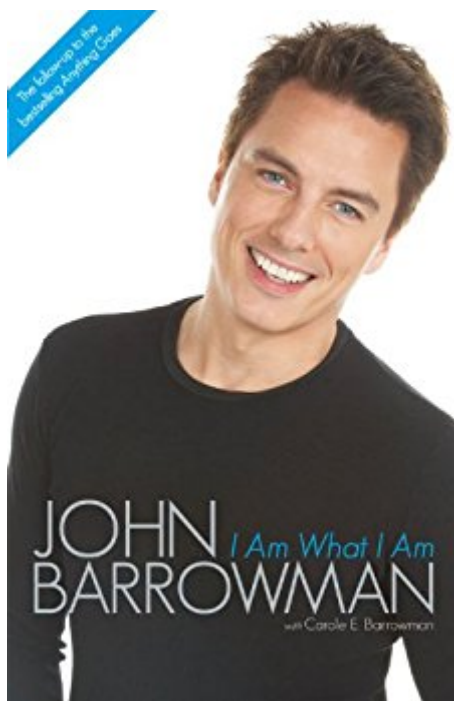

Let me say first that I am a fan of John Barrowman. I like his work, have seen him on stage, screen and TV. That having been said, I found this book (and it's predecessor) to be a bit of a cheat. After going to great (sometimes absurd) lengths to create an illusion of intimacy with the reader, he shows us a carefully crafted version of himself that is no more, nor less than what will bolster his existing public persona. That is not intimacy, that is manipulation. His rather enormous ego can also be distracting (Is he really saying with a straight (pardon the pun) face that Kevin Kline and Ashley Judd were his "co-stars" in *De-Lovely*? If you blinked, you missed him...) He is a charming and talented man, both he and his readers would have been better served with more frankness and less posturing than is on display here.

In this follow up of John Barrowman's *Anything Goes*, John with his sister Carole have taken us by the hand into John's wonderful family and entertainment life. Having been the handsome character Captain Jack Harkness in *Dr. Who* and the lead in *Torchwood*, John tells more stories. He tells of his partner Scott and their dogs. More of his family's antics when it comes to playing pranks on each other. And a few sweet and naughty things he's done. It is a quick and funny read. There are many pictures of John's family and friends. I recommend it.
