

## **Synopsis**

Captain Arthur Mathison was a merchant seaman from 1932 to 1977. He sailed with a number of British shipping companies, but he spent many years with Bolton Steamship Company of London and R.S. Dalglish Limited of Newcastle upon Tyne. He set sail from many of the main British ports - London, Glasgow, Hull, Cardiff, Newport, Newcastle, Middlesborough and Liverpool, plus a number of lesser locations like Workington, and he has tales from most of them. He started his career as an able-bodied seaman and cabin boy on steamships, and finished it as master of ocean going motor vessels. In his own words he describes the hard times endured by pre-war merchant seaman during the Great Depression, and the subsequent challenges of the Second World War. He spent many years in the tramp steamer trade, travelling to all the continents of the world, including a great deal of time trading between Australia and New Zealand. In these pages you will find first hand stories of freak waves, convoys, on-board violence, red light districts, drunken crew members, near misses, dubious bunkering and much more. The book is a personal testament to an age of seafaring that has now vanished.

I've been looking forward to a book like this that describes daily life aboard British merchant marine ships. The author started off as a cabin boy and through hard work and initiative worked his way up to Master. The interest comes from the everyday problems of personalities, time schedules, breakdowns, maintenance and the satisfaction of completing what the author and the crew were hired to do. The book makes you feel like you're spending an evening with the storyteller reviewing old memories. A pleasant read that is very satisfying. If tales of the sea are not your thing, you might find it a bit tedious, But I couldn't get enough of it and hated to see the book come to its end.

If you want to know the nitty-gritty realities of life in the British merchant marine in the 20th century, this memoir is what you're looking for. The author went to sea in the 1930s and retired in the 1980s. He describes the highs and lows of life at sea, including during WWII. I don't think he invented anything; it all is too authentic and true to human nature to have been made up. If you're looking for a story of high adventure, however, this book is not for you. But that's precisely why I enjoyed it so much. The author describes things I've wondered about such as how to load a hold, how to deal with shore-bound shipping line bureaucrats, what it's like to deal with corrupt practices in the docks, bad captains and good captains, how crew members settle their differences, and of course storms at sea. If you aren't looking for sensationalism, but want to know what it really was (and probably still is) like, you'll enjoy this book.
